

Feedback and Action Taken Report for Academic Year 2021-22

Feedback Report on Institutional Facilities

The college wants to provide the best possible environment of learning experience to encourage students to explore their full potential for academic achievement. Students, teachers, parents and alumni play an important role in the evaluation, development and enhancement of the quality of this learning process. Feedback from students, teachers, parents and alumni helps the college to make changes as per stakeholder's requirements. Feedback system make the students collaborator rather than only passive receivers of teaching and learning process. All the stakeholders' feedback data was collected and analyzed for the academic year 2021-22. Student Satisfaction Index (SSI) of Institutional Facilities is **3.45 out of 4**.

Feedback Analysis about Institutional Facilities:

Total 88% students have agreed that the Institute promotes them for internship, exchange programs and field visits. 91% of students are satisfied with their cognitive, emotional and social growth during their undergraduate and postgraduate studies. 83 % students fully agree with the availability of multiple opportunities by the institution to learn and grow. 82% students are happy by the efforts taken in quality improvement of teaching and learning process. Nearly 86 % students are satisfied with the overall teaching and learning process of the institute.

Students have made some suggestions such as

1. Cleanliness of classrooms/ground.
2. Increase in the parking area.
3. Arrangement of Study tours/field visits.
4. Sitting out area in the campus.
5. Regular Sharing of exam/scholarship information from office.

Recommendations:

Cleaning of classrooms including benches and ground should be done every day. Avoiding student's waiting time in the parking area can solve parking issue. According to availability of the ground, it can be used as sitting out area. Office staff should be provide comfort to the students by giving appropriate information related to Exams/Scholarships.

Action Taken on student's suggestions:

Study tours/field visits will be arranged as Covid-19 pandemic situation is coming normal this year. Cleaning contract is given to new agency to take care of the campus and classrooms. Availability of the College ground will be checked according to the regular PT schedule and matches, then it can be used as a sitting out area by the students. Office staff is instructed to look into student's problem related to examination form filling as well as scholarship issues. Instrumentation center is facilitated for research activity.



Feedback Report on Teaching- learning Process

The Student Satisfaction Index (SSI) of Curriculum is **3.4 out of 4**. This analysis will help to improve the quality of teaching and learning. Feedback is an important part of the learning cycle, and student learning outcome is linked to institutional effectiveness. With this complete picture of student feedback, instructors can take steps to improve course delivery, content, and their overall teaching performance.

Feedback Analysis about Teaching and learning process in the Institution:

90 % of students are satisfied with the completion of syllabus in the class. 82% of students agreed about the discussion of assignments given to them. 87% students appreciated use of student centered learning methods such as experiential learning, participative learning etc. 85% of students are happy with the communication skills of the teachers. Teaching approach of the teachers is rated as good, very good and excellent by 96%. Assignments are timely discussed with the students, said 95% students. 90% of students say that they are promoted for internships, exchange programs, extracurricular activities. 96 % students agree that the teaching learning process of the institute is helping their emotional, cognitive and social growth by providing multiple opportunities. Course and program outcomes are always communicated to them. They are delighted with the support and help from their mentors. 95 % of students say that teachers are clearing the concepts by giving examples and related applications. 88 % of students agree about showing them the right path after analyzing their strengths and weaknesses. 84 % of students appreciated the college monitoring system to improve the quality of teaching and learning process. Nearly 90% of the students agree about the use of student centric methods to enhance learning experiences. Teachers are making efforts to develop their employability skills through the placement cell of the college. Teachers are using ICT tools in daily teaching. 85 % of students are very happy with the teaching learning process in the college.

Recommendations:

It is recommended to inform all the teachers to complete the whole syllabus according to academic calendar time. It is strongly recommended to the teachers to use innovative teaching methods, experiential learning methods, Participative learning to make lectures more interesting and interactive.

Students have made some suggestions such as

1. Implementation of vocational training courses of computer and digital technology development.
2. Sharing of information related to availability of internships.
3. Sessions on Personality Development, Life Skills, Soft Skills, MPSC and UPSC Exam preparation.
4. Students want assignments that need a lot of research, reading and analytical skills.
5. Starting M.Voc in Food Processing Technology
6. Want more exposure to extracurricular activities



Action taken on student's suggestions:

Students wanted Offline practical and theory sessions which are already started by following Government's instructions. Sessions on Personality Development, Life Skills, Soft Skills, MPSC and UPSC Exam preparation are also arranged. Teachers are trying to find out internship information to share with the students. Management is thinking to start M.VOc course as per the student's suggestions.

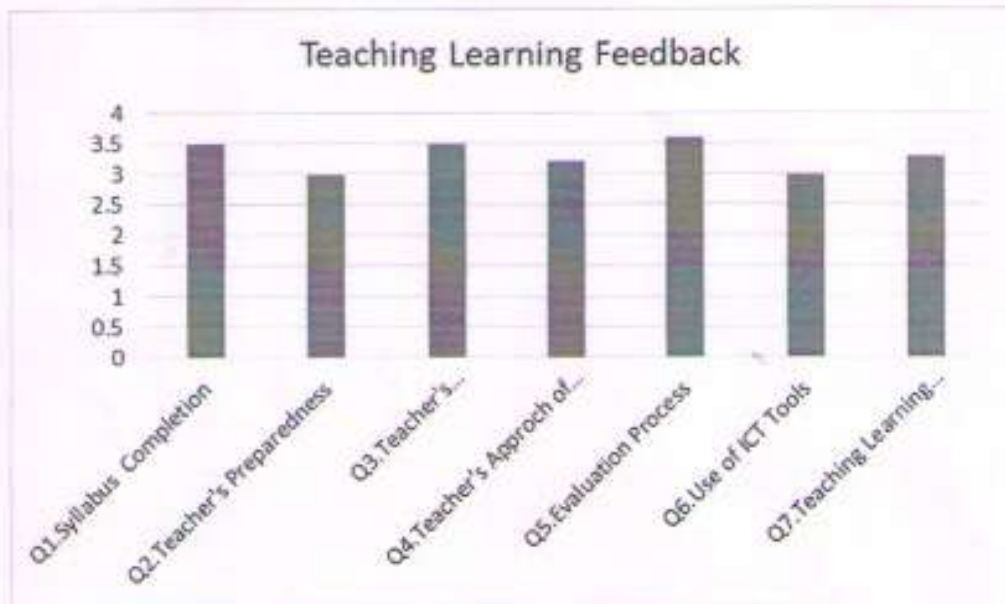

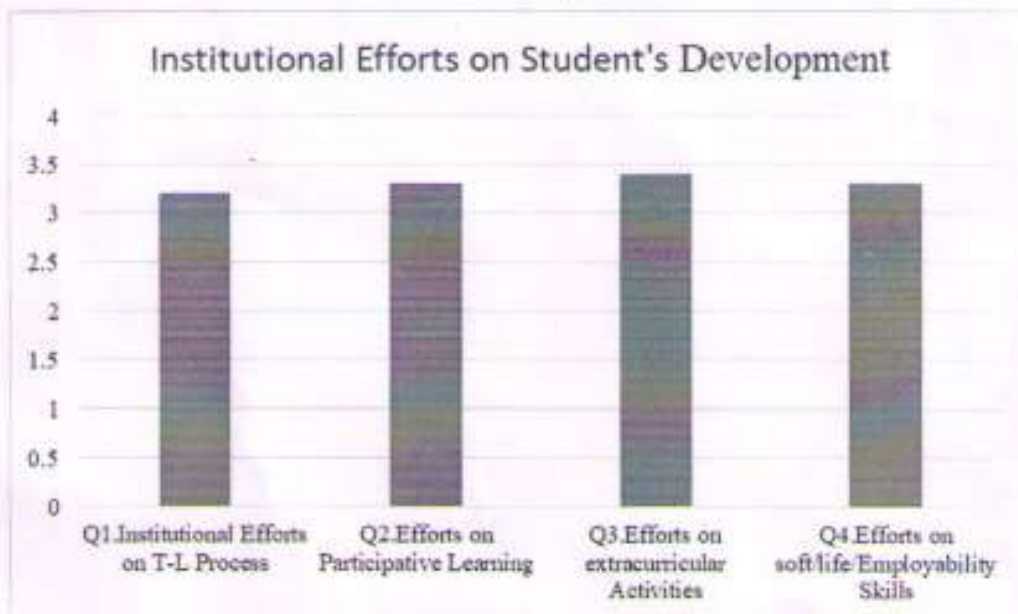


Figure 2

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
